

IMPORTANT INFORMATION ABOUT YOUR DRINKING WATER

VILLA RICA's Monitoring Requirements Not Met for Radionuclides

Our water system recently violated monitoring requirements for drinking water. Although this incident was not an emergency, as our customers, you have a right to know what happened and what we are doing to correct this situation.

We are required to monitor your drinking water for specific contaminants on a regular basis. Results of regular monitoring are an indicator of whether or not our drinking water meets health standards. From 1/1/2008 – 12/31/2016, we did not monitor or test for Radionuclides and therefore cannot be sure of the quality of our drinking water during that time.

What should I do?

There is nothing that you need to do at this time. You may continue to drink the water. If a situation arises where the water is no longer safe to drink, you will be notified within 24 hours.

What is being done?

As of now, we are waiting until our next monitoring compliance period, which is 1/1/18 – 12/31/18 to sample for Radionuclides. The samples taken during this period will put the Villa Rica Water System back into compliance. The last time that the Radionuclides samples were collected by the Villa Rica Water System, all contaminants tested for were below indicator levels and not detected.

What should I do?

There is nothing you need to do at this time. You may continue to drink the water. If a situation arises where the water is no longer safe to drink, you will be notified within 24 hours.

What is being done?

Our staff at the Villa Rica Water Treatment Plant completed the Inorganic Chemical (IOC) sampling for the 1/1/2017 – 12/31/2017 monitoring compliance period on 2/27/17. Out of all of the contaminants tested for in this sample, none were detected. This sample, along with this public notification, puts the Villa Rica Water System back into compliance.
